The vineyards are not fertilized—we condition the land by sowing broad beans and peas, and we do not use any chemical products."



Climate

Soils

ortonian/Helvetian Soils:

Tortonian soils, found in the Barolo region, are composed of marl & limestone, contributing to the elegance & structure.


Helvetian soils, found in areas like Barbaresco, contain more sand and have a higher proportion of marine deposits.

Marl/Limestone:

Marl, a combination of clay & limestone, is prevalent in many areas of Piedmont.Soils rich in marl contribute to good drainage and water retention

Calcareous Soils:

Calcareous soils, which contain a significant amount of limestone, are common in several sub-regions. Limestone contributes to the structure and minerality of the wines, enhancing the aging potential of Nebbiolo.

Alluvial Soils:


Alluvial soils are widespread in Veneto, especially in areas near rivers & water bodies. Alluvial soils contribute to the development of fresh & fruity wines.

Morainic/Glacial Deposits:

In certain areas, especially around Lake Garda, there are deposits of morainic & glacial origin.
These soils can be rich in mineral content & contribute to the complexity & structure of the wines.

Calcareous Soil:

Calcareous soils, which contain limestone, are found in various parts of Veneto. Limestone contributes to good drainage & can impart minerality to the wines.

Veneto is a prominent wine-producing region in northeastern Italy, known for its diverse range of wines, including some of Italy's most famous varieties. The region's varied terroir, which includes hills, plains, & a coastal area, contributes to the production of both red and white wines. The Hills of Verona, stretching from Soave westwards to lake Garda, have such fertile volcanic soil that vegetation grows uncontrollably; the vine runs riot on every terrace and pergola, among villas & cypresses that are the image of Italian grace, for Veneto has become Italy1s most productive wine region.

SUPER TUSCAN

Note

The term "Super Tuscan" gained popularity in the 1970s & 1980s when some Tuscan winemakers. dissatisfied with the restrictions of the traditional appellation system, began producing wines that didn't conform to those regulations. While Super Tuscans are known for their innovative blending practices and often include international grape varieties, Montalcino is a traditional, single-varietal wine exclusively made from Sangiovese. Both categories represent the diversity & excellence of Tuscan winemaking, each with its unique characteristics & historical significance

The Montalcino wine region is not only renowned for its Brunello wines but also for the picturesque landscape and historic villages that make it a popular destination for wine enthusiasts. Means "reserve" and is legally defined. This term usually indicates extended ageing (in cask, then bottle) and can denote lower yields and higher alcohol depending on the appellation.

SUPERIORE

Denotes higher level of alcohol or longer aging depending on the appellation

FRIZZANTE

Lightly sparkling

Sparkling

DRY

APPASSIMENTO

Grapes are harvested and laid on mats or hung up to dry over the autumn months

RECIOTO/PASSITO

Wine made from dried grapes that is often sweet

CUVÉE:

A blend of many non-sparkling wines designed to become a well-balanced sparkling wine

TAWNY

sweet, oak-aged, fortified wines made from red grapes that are grown in the Douro Valley in Portugal

RUBY

Young port wine aged in the bottle
